



# Senior Charity Application Checklist

Grants for Seniors — Printable Resource

## Documents to Gather

- Government-issued ID (driver's license, state ID, or passport)
- Proof of income (Social Security letter, pension statement, pay stubs)
- Proof of residence (lease, mortgage, or recent utility bill)
- Health/Disability documentation (if applicable)
- List of monthly expenses (rent, utilities, medications)
- Names & phone numbers of emergency contacts

## Before You Apply

- Identify your top 2–3 needs: food, rent/utility help, home repairs, transportation, companionship
- Check that the charity serves your ZIP code/county
- Verify eligibility (age, income limits, residency, documentation)
- Create a folder (paper or digital) for all documents
- Write down questions to ask (waitlists, timelines, required forms)

## Where to Start (Trusted Options)

- Meals on Wheels — home-delivered meals and wellness checks
- Feeding America — local food banks & CSFP for seniors
- Catholic Charities — emergency rent/utility support
- Eldercare Locator (ACL) — find local aging services: 1-800-677-1116
- NCOA BenefitsCheckUp.org — screen for SNAP, SSI, Medicare Savings, energy aid

## Pro Tips

- Apply to more than one program to avoid delays or waitlists

- Keep photocopies or photos of everything you submit
- Ask about priority/expedited processing for seniors with urgent needs
- If phone is easier, call 2-1-1 for local assistance referrals
